I'M OVER 50. Can New Lens Implants Really Make Me Glasses-Free?

From the Wall Street Journal to Newsweek to our own Sun Sentinel, you've probably all seen information on the new lens implants that are allowing people over 50 to see at a distance and up close again without glasses. The two lenses that we are most excited about are the ReSTOR[®] (Alcon) and ReZoom[™] (AMO) implants. We're offering these lenses to cataract sufferers who would like to regain sharp, vibrant vision and virtually eliminate their use of glasses, and to those over the age of 50 who are simply tired of reaching for bifocals all the time.

"We've had good success with multifocal lenses here at The Center For LASIK", says Dr. Randy Burks. "We carefully screen prospective patients on their vision expectations, and custom fit the lens selection so that we deliver the most useful vision for a patient post-operatively. We don't often stop to think about the type of vision we each find most useful. For some, it is up-

for reading. I tried new glasses and many combinations of contacts but my vision just wasn't sharp. During a routine exam, I asked the doctor about LASIK. Seven days before the Masters Golf Tournament in April, 70-year-old Gary Player had an artificial lens, called the ReZoom, implanted in his left eye. In the first round, the hall-offame golfer birdied the first hole, which he attributes largely to his sharpened vision. A month later, he had the surgery in his right eye. close vision for reading the newspaper, maps or doing close work like sewing. Others prefer intermediate vision at a range of a computer screen or shaving and putting on make-up. Still others demand precise, sharp vision at a distance for sports, hunting or night driving. While an artificial lens can never exactly replicate the vision you have with your natural crystalline lens, we can come close with these new lens implants. Cataract surgery has really shifted from something you delay as long as possible, to something you willingly choose as soon as your vision impacts your daily life. It's a significant way to regain what age has taken away."

These new lenses take about 30 minutes to insert and involve only topical anesthetic. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) ruled in May 2005 that Medicare beneficiaries can choose one of several multifocal IOLs for an additional fee as part of their Medicare-covered cataract surgery. Prior to the May ruling, Medicare patients had to opt for the traditional distance-vision IOLs. "That's a big step forward for patients because they have now have access to the best technology possible at a reasonable cost," says Dr. Gailitis.



Q: What is a cataract?

Dr. Burks: At birth, the eye's natural lens is clear and flexible, but as we age it yellows and hardens, and may become cloudy. This condition is called a cataract, and will afflict almost everyone over the age of 60. A cataract can progress until eventually there is a complete loss of vision in your eye. Surgery is the only way a cataract can be removed, and we should discuss surgery when your cataracts cause enough loss of vision to interfere with your daily activities.

Q: What are the new multifocal lenses?

Dr. Gailitis: Traditional monofocal IOLs will give you clear distance vision, but you will probably need glasses for reading and close, detailed work. On the other hand, the new multifocal IOLs like ReSTOR and ReZoom are specifically designed to help you see well at all distances—near, far and in between—usually without the need for glasses.

Q: Am I a candidate for the new multifocal IOLs?

Dr. Burks: Most people who are candidates for monofocal IOLs can choose the multifocal IOLs as well. We'll review your lifestyle and hobbies during your consultation so that we can be sure to recommend the appropriate IOL for you. We look forward to meeting you and discussing options that can help you regain your crisp, clear vision.
